 thousand eight hundred and fifty six personally appeared before me Julius S. Barnsback  
 a Justice of the Peace duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid, John  
Everette aged 37 years, a resident of Madison County  
 in the State of Illinois who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical John  
Everette who was a Private in the Company commanded by  
 Captain Daniel Powell in the Regiment of Mounted  
Volunteers commanded by Colonel William C. Banks in the Indian  
War commonly called the Black Hawk War  
 that he Volunteered at Warren's White County, Mo. on or about the first  
day of May A. D. 1832 for the term of three months or  
During the Campaign, not sure which, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of three months of twenty days  
 and was honorably discharged at Dixon, Ill. County, Mo. on or about the 20<sup>th</sup>  
 day of August A. D. 1832 on account of Disbanding of Troops at that time  
 as will appear by the Muster Roll now on file at the Department  
in Washington City

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty land to which he may be entitled, under the "Act grant-  
 ing bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," passed  
 Sept. 28th, 1850.
