 these presents shall come greeting, Knowye, that by virtue and in consideration  
 of our Land Office Treasury Warrants N<sup>o</sup>. 587.. 588. 590.. and 591. there is granted  
 by the said Commonwealth unto Adam Broil a certain tract or parcel of land  
 containing fifteen hundred acres by survey bearing date the seventeenth day of  
 August one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven lying and being in  
Meigs County on the middle fork of Rockcastle. and bounded as followeth  
 To wit Beginning at three lime tree poplars and sycamores standing on the  
 East side of Rockcastle three quarters of a mile above the trees from the  
 Settlement to Bourneborough running from thence South 45° East 600 Poles  
 crossing Rockcastle four times to three poplars from one root & two white  
 oaks thence South 45 East 400 Poles. to a sycam and two Jugon trees  
 standing on the bank of Rockcove creek thence South 45 West 600 Poles  
 to three Jugon trees two white oaks and a sycam on the bank of a creek  
 thence South 45 West 400 poles to the Beginning

With its appurtenances To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of  
 Land with its appurtenances to the said Adam Broil and his Heirs forever  
 In witness whereof the said James Garrard Esq. Governor of the Common-  
 wealth of Kentucky hath hereunto for his hand caused the seal of the  
 Commonwealth to be affixed at Frankfort on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of  
 May in the year of our Lord 1798 and of the Commonwealth the sixth  
 L. S. By the Governor

As perable to an Order Survey issued from the  
 Hon<sup>ble</sup> the County Court of Fleming and to me  
 directed, I have surveyed a part of Land surveyed for  
 the Estate of Adam Breyler, and the boundaries  
 whereof are uncertain according to the Original  
 Survey; which Survey is bound as follows, to wit  
 Beginning at A two sugar trees at the forks of a  
 small branch as called for in the Original patent  
 thence North 60 poles to a hickory and two black  
 Oaks newly marked, standing North 59 degrees  
 West 24 poles from a Walnut and sugar tree, as called  
 for in the Original patent and represented in the plat  
 by letter E, thence from the Corner at B the hickory and two  
 black Oaks East 400 poles to C a hickory & white oak, no  
 corner being found, according to the old patent, thence  
 South 600 poles to (D) a red oak & an ulberry (both dead  
 & standing in the field of Isaac Constant, North sixty  
 nine West sixty four poles from two sugar trees growing  
 from one root makes for a corner, I supposed to be the  
 no Grant located



Corner called for in the the patent, and design also in  
the plat by the letter F, thence West 400 poles to the  
Beginning, containing 1500 acres.
