

In the name of God Amen the 19th day of July 1761 I Francis Donilly of the County of Augusta and Colony of Virginia being sick and weak in Body but of good and sound Memory thanks be to Almighty God and calling to remembrance the uncertain Estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield to Death when it shall please God to call do make constitute Ordain and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following revoking and annulling by these presents all and every Testament and Testament

Will and Wills heretofore by me made and declared either by word
or writing and this is to be taken only for my last will and
Testament and none other and first being sorry and penitent
from the Bottom of my Heart for my sins Past I give & bequeath
my soul unto Almighty God my Saviour & redemer in whom
and by the Merits of Iesus Christ I trust and beleive assuredly to
be saved and to have full remission and forgiveness of all my
sins and that my soul with my Body at a general day of the
resurrection shall rise again with Joy & my Body be buried in
such a place where it shall please my Executors hereafter
named to Appoint and now for the settling of my temporal Estate
and such Goods Chattels and Debts as it hath pleased God far above
my deserts to bestow upon me I do order give and dispose the same
in Manner and form following that is to say first I will and
all these Debts and Dues as I owe to any manner of Person or
Persons whatsoever shall be well and truly contented and paid
or Ordained to be paid within convenient time after my
decease by my Executors hereafter named Item I give and bequeath
unto Sarah Donnelly my beloved wife and the Child then now
with the third of all my Moveables and the Land I allow to be
divided Amongst my six Sons viz James Henry Francis William
John & James if any of them dies to be divided Among the rest
Equally and to Mary Donnelly my Daughter I allow the same
Share to keep the Stock and all together and I allow my wife to
have the care of the whole whilst they live together and to have
the Benefit of the plantation she now lives on for the support of the
Family & I do Appoint my wife W^m Ledgerwood and James
Callison Executors of my last will & Testament ^{In} Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal the date of year above written
