paid to her within one month after my decease to and for her sole use and  
benefit and her receipt alone notwithstanding her coverture to be a sufficient  
discharge to my executors hereinafter named & give and convey unto  
my mother Elizabeth still the whole of my money in the savings bank  
Montague Street pluswell square and also the whole of my money in  
the union Loan Society along with together all interest due thereon con-  
pactly and also all and every debt and debts due and owing to me at  
the time of my decease & also give and convey unto my said mo-  
ther all my household furniture plate linen china books prints and per-  
tures and all other my estate and effects whatsoever and whatsoever  
to and for her own sole absolute use and benefit and & that my executors  
and executor hereinafter named to collect and get in all and every the  
debt and debts due and owing to me and as and when the same shall  
be required to pay the same to my said mother & thereby appoint my  
said sister Mary still and Richard Staines of No 25 Eastie Street of the  
County of Middlesex and executor of this my will and hereby revoke all for-  
mer and other wills by me at any time heretofore made herein to be  
be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have at the end  
of foot hereof set my hand this twenty fifth day of February one thou-  
sand eight hundred and forty seven. John Hill. Signed by the said  
John Hill the testator as and for his last will and testament in the  
presence of us two in his presence at his request and in the presence  
of our other two witnesses subscribed our names as witnesses at
