Hamilton County S. S. October 3rd 1836

This day being the 3rd day of October 1836. Thomas Gann, a Revolutionary pensioner, personally appeared in open Court, and made oath in due form of law, that he has lost out of his possession, his pension certificate, on which he was entitled to receive fifty dollars per annum payable semi-annually on the 4th of March and 4th of September in every year, during his natural life, that there are now three payments in arrears and that this is the second affidavit he has made of the loss of his said certificate, the number of which he does not recollect that he mailed his first affidavit of the loss of it at Saddy post office in this County, Col William Clift post master, that he has not sold transferred or in any wise disposed of his interest in said certificate to any person whatever, that he alone is justly entitled to the benefits of the same, that he can get no information respecting his first affidavit above mentioned, wherefore he prays that another certificate may issue to him, directed to Saddy post office Hamilton County Tennessee, and that he refers to B. B. Cannon and Thomas Layman
