## Miscellaneous.

The ship Shawmut, 1,037 tons, is now on the Great Balance Dock for repairs. She will be stripped, recaulked and newly coppered.

SHIPBUILDING AT GREENPOINT.—Messrs. Lawrence & Foulke have at their yard, foot of North 5th-st., a small ferry-boat of about 60 tons, for Havana. This, with the exception of one or two mud machines, is all the work they are doing.

Mr. F. F. Williams has at his yard in Greenpoint, a mail boat for the Sandwich Islands. She is schooner rig, 100 tons burden, very sharp, and is intended to carry mails and passengers between the Sandwich Islands. She will be ready about the 15th of November. Mr. Williams is also building a schooner, of about 225 tons, named the Tactics, for Charles Shuman, of New-Orleans, intended for the Brazos and Santiago trade. She will be launched about the 25th of November.

Mr. Samuel Sneed is building at his yard, at Greenpoint, a long, sharp and swallow stern wheel-boat for the Magdalena River, New-Granada. She is 150 feet long, 18 feet wide, and 5 feet deep, and will be ready about the 1st of November.
