By virtue of a warrant for two hundred acres of land Granted unto
Peter Pinafton of Amherst County the fourteenth day of
October Seventeen hundred and Six Thomas Sheppard to Certifie that

Have laid out for y^e said Pinafton all that parcel of land called
Marlborough plain lying and being on y^e North side of y^e Great
branch of Patuxent River Beginning at two round white stakes
standing by a run called Stony Run and running west by south
two hundred and twenty y^e to a bound white stake standing
on a hill by y^e north branch of Patuxent River then south by west
downe the said branch one hundred y^e then south west
seventeen y^e then south by east twenty y^e then east south
east thirty three y^e then east sixty y^e then east by south
forty four y^e then north twenty y^e then north west by north
one hundred y^e then north thirty six y^e then east by north
one hundred y^e then south east by east seventy four y^e then
south south east thirty eight y^e to a bound white stake then
south east by east twenty five y^e then east north east twenty
eight y^e then north west by west forty y^e then north
thirty five y^e then wth a straight line to the first red post &
paid out for one hundred & fifty acres more or less to be held of Amherst
County by Henry Parua Jun^r exam^r of y^e said Pinafton
