manded by *Captain James Giles* — having faith-
fully served the time required by law, is hereby discharged; and is entitled
to a bounty of *Six hundred and forty* —
acres of land, as recognized by "An Act for making compensation to the
"troops in the service of this state," &c. passed at Augusta the 24th Decem-
ber, 1789, and shall receive the same when special appropriations are made
by law. *Ecc*
